PRE - KINDER

GIRLS

- 1 sturdy houseplant with pot base (no cactus or poisonous plants)
- 1 box of 24 thin crayons
- 1 package of white recycled bond paper (100 sheets)
- 3 #2 sharpened yellow pencils
- 1 pack of various colors of modeling clay in strips
- 1 white liquid glue - large size
- 4 adhesive glue sticks
- 1 set of medium sized colored markers
- 1 package of whiteboard markers
- 2 container of play dough (not Vinci)
- 1 hardcover story-picture book in English for classroom library
- 1 complete change of clothes with name in a large zip lock bag
- 1 family photo no larger than 4x6 in a simple picture frame
- 30 buttons of different sizes
- 3 toy cars
- 1 medium squared or rectangular wicker basket **without handle**
- 1 box of baby wipes

BOYS

- 1 large box of tissue
- 1 package of 100 sheets colored bond paper (no fluorescent colors)
- 1 box of adhesive bandages
- 1 packs of various colors of modeling clay in strips
- 2 large paintbrushes
- 3 small paintbrushes
- 4 adhesive glue sticks
- 1 set of thin colored markers
- 1 set of colored pencils
- 2 containers of play dough (not Vinci)
- 1 hardcover story-picture book in English for classroom library
- 1 complete change of clothes with name in a large zip lock bag
- 1 family photo no larger than 4x6 in a simple picture frame
- 2 bags of beads
- 30 buttons of different sizes
- 3 medium size plastic animals or insects
- 1 box of baby wipes
