WWW is a High School program fully linked to students' curriculum. It is a week long program, once a

# Basic Definitions — WWW Trips

#### **WWW Overnight**

**Trip:** "a week long intensive educational program that focuses especially on the acquisition of competencies and the development of skills and techniques in a particular area of knowledge, usually inside the mainstream ASFG curricular experience with complementary cultural and curricular connections". Example: WWW Washington

 Philadelphia (linked to the U.S. History curriculum in 11<sup>th</sup> grade and College Counseling).

The overnight trip pedagogical tools are on site hands on activities, lectures from guides at historic sites, readings and questionnaires, lectures from resident experts and discussion groups that emphasize mastery of key program-

matic concepts (historic processes, facts and data) and the exchange of ide-

# **FAQs**

## Can a student not participate in WWW?

All students must participate in the WWW program.

### What about students who cannot travel?

Students who choose not to travel will participate in WWW workshops.

#### How does ASFG choose the focus of trips and workshops?

- -Safety is a priority -Scholastic focus on curriculum links
- -Development of school spirit and identity
- -Cost effective options for parents

## When does WWW occur each year?

Dates may vary depending on the school year calendar.

# Who supervises the WWW trips and workshops?

All WWW trips and workshops are chaperoned by ASFG staff. Trips are chaperoned at a 10:1 ratio of students to ASFG staff.

### How are students evaluated?

Students receive a grade for WWW which represents 10% of their grade in one grading quarter in all classes. Teachers provide a grading rubric that involves: academic work, presentations, participation, behavior, etc.

# What happens if students break WWW rules?

Students are expected to behave and cooperate with the whole group to make the experience as enjoyable as possible. Safety is our priority and all rules should be followed at all times. Therefore, continuous misbehavior may result in sending the student home, trip suspensions, or restricted participation in planned activities. Moreover, each case is analyzed separately and depending on the fault's gravity corrective actions will be taken

#### What is the cost of WWW?

The cost is **not included** in the tuition and varies depending on the final destination. **Each year we offer free or low-cost workshops.** 

All quotes found on this website include all required costs of trips or workshops except for personal items such as souvenirs, gifts, etc.

### Is having an overnight workshop viable?

Yes. Having overnight workshops \*2-3 days\* to nearby locations is an option. For example, WWW Biking to Tapalpa, Tu Techo in Atemajac, etc.

## **WWW** Grade

Students receive a grade for WWW which represents 10% of their grade in one grading quarter in all classes.

This is why it is very important that the student signs up in the WWW program on time. In other words, the sign up process is the first step a student needs to accomplish in order to receive a WWW grade.

## How does the sign up process work?

The payment at the school's cashier will count as your sign up process. If the workshop is free, the student must sign up in the HS office to secure his/her spot.

#### What happens if the student does not sign up on time?

If the sign up process has already closed and the student does not belong neither to a trip or workshop, he/she automatically will be required to attend a mandatory meeting on a Friday 2:45 p.m.-5:00 p.m. where the sign up process and expectations will be explained one last time.

A second sign up date will open, but this date will also have a deadline. It is the student's responsibility to directly give the receipt to the WWW Coordinator.

# What happens if the student does not sign up in this second opportunity? If the student does not sign

If the student does not sign up in this second opportunity then he/she will:

- automatically receive a 0% for his/her WWW grade
- not come to school during this WWW

#### **General Information WWW:**

- Each workshop and trip has limited space.
- If the student does not travel than he/she must sign up for a workshop.
- The payment at the school's cashier will count as your sign up process. Cash
  payments are NOT admitted. If the workshop is free, the student must sign up
  in the high school office to secure their spot.
- We follow the payment rule: "first come, first serve".
- No payments at banks will be accepted for WWW trips.
- As always, please see Mr. Lemmon or Mr. Parson if making this payment will be difficult.

#### **WWW Workshops:**

• Some workshops are free and others have a cost.

#### **WWW Trips:**

- If you are the 31st payment or later, you will be put on a waiting list in the order which you paid.
- All payments are non-refundable except if the trip is cancelled.
- In some cases if payments have already been made but the student can't go on a trip, transfers are possible. However, the job of finding a student to "buy" the transferred ticket rests with the student/family, not the WWW Coordinator, nor ASFG.
- If sign-ups surpass the limit, we will consider the remote possibility of expanding the trip or creating another independent trip with the same itinerary. However, there is absolutely no guarantee that we will be able to do either of these.
- After the trip is full or the deadline has passed, the official waiting list is maintained by Miss Jocelin Diaz. Please contact her directly if a student is interested in placing their name on the waiting list.

## Cashier Window and Payment Option

The school's cashier window is open from 7:45 a.m. to 2:45 p.m. and cash payments are NOT admitted. The following options of payment are the only ones available at the School's Cashier Window:

- Checks made out to The American School Foundation of Guadalajara, A.C.
- Credit or Debit Card (We do take American Express).

  There will be a late fee: 2% for each payment that comes in late.

In the past, ASFG gave parents the option to pay for WWW trips in cash in the school's dollar account. However, due to an internal change at SHCP, this will not be possible this school year. This is not an ASFG decision and we cannot modify this decision. Thank you for your understanding.
